To begin, log into the site and navigate to a page where you have edit permissions. Select Edit Page.

1. To delete a segment navigate to the segment and press the X next to the Edit button. Press Ok when it asks for confirmation.

Moving Segments within a Region

1. Navigate to the segment you want to move.
2. Select the Up Arrow or the Down Arrow next to the Edit button for the Segment. This will move the segment up or down within the region. In the example below, by clicking on the Up Arrow on the Rev. Bloom segment, it will move it above the segment for Rev. Morales.

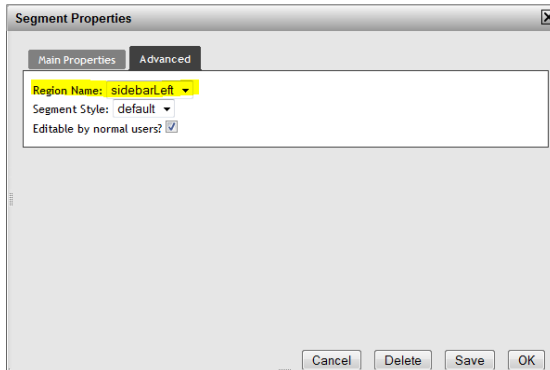
<p>Edit </p> 	<p>The Rev. Peter Morales, former senior minister at JUC, is now President of UUA, elected in 2009 on a platform for growth and multiculturalism. We were lucky enough to retain him as a Community Minister, although we don't see him as often as we'd like. From 2002 to 2004, Peter was the UUA Director for District Services. He has also served on the UUA Board of Trustees, as trustee from the Mountain Desert District, and on the Unitarian Universalist Ministers Association (UUMA) Executive Committee.</p> <p>Before entering the ministry, Peter was a Fulbright lecturer in Spain, a newspaper editor and publisher in Oregon, a Knight International Press Fellow in Peru, and a regional manager in California state government. Morales grew up in San Antonio, Texas. He graduated with a B.A. from the University of the Pacific in Stockton, California, in 1967. He earned his M.Phil in American Studies from the University of Kansas in 1976 and his M.Div. from the Starr King School for the Ministry in Berkeley, California, in 1999.</p> <p>Peter and his wife, Phyllis Windrem Morales, have been married for forty-two years. They have two adult children, Miguel and Marcela. Phyllis is very active on our UUSC task force, and Marcela is current co-chair of our annual auction.</p>
<p>Edit </p> 	<p>Rev. Barry Bloom is the Minister for Spiritual Life at JUC. It is a part-time position created by Barry and Peter Morales to serve the growing interests in spiritual life and growth shown in the congregation. He leads spiritually-themed services several times a year, creates retreats and workshops on spiritual themes (<i>The Spiritual Life of Couples</i> and <i>What Happens to Us When We Die</i> are recent examples.), does pastoral care/spiritual direction as requested, and supports the rest of the JUC staff in seeing through a spiritual lens.</p> <p>Barry grew up in Missouri, spent ten years on Cape Cod, MA, where he became a UU, then moved to Colorado in 1987. He had a previous career in the counseling field, beginning in the addictions field, then expanding to general work with couples, families, experiential therapy groups, men's groups, as well as individual counseling. He has also directed choirs (community and church, including JUC from 1989-1995), directed community and high school plays, and served as a classroom teacher. He was ordained by Columbine UU Church in 2002.</p> <p>Barry attended schools in Missouri (BS in Ed, Truman State U) and Missouri U/Columbia (M.Ed. in Counseling). In preparation for ministry he attended Iliff School of Theology in Denver (1990-92) and graduated with a D.Min from the University of Creation Spirituality in 2000.</p> <p>He says he "...loves ministry, especially this ministry. To return to my home congregation after years away and bring the spiritual focus I had always wanted to bring is very cool. I feel blessed."</p>

Moving Segments to a different region

1. In this example we will move an image from the right region to the left region. To do this you, you must edit the segment.



2. In the segment properties editing window, select the advanced tab and select a different region.



3. Now it is displaying in the Left Sidebar.
